Ghost Dance

Emilia Izquierdo (UK) – 05:00

Using as base the 1894 filming of the Sioux American Indians dancing the 'Ghost Dance' the piece explores dance as protest, dance as a form of resistance against injustice and the imposition of foreign powers. Using hand drawn animation and archival footage of the Sioux together with footage from protest dances in other locations such as Gaza, South Africa, Peru, Jerusalem, Armenia among others. Sound concept inspired by Vicente Huidobro.

Gong batu means "sound of stone". This project recorded many soundscapes of Kitagi Island, which was famous as stone industry. When confronting the world, do you have the power to actively listen with your supple ears? This is a way of life.





Do computers dream?

retrospective of Alessandro Amaducci, Prokultura, 20.5. - 23.5. 2021.

The project wants to celebrate Alessandro Amaducci, one of the most representative Italian artists on the international scene of the contemporary art languages, with an always innovative vision in the relationship between arts and new technologies.

Since 1989 Amaducci realized about 80 single-channel audiovisual works, in addition to video installations, documentaries, video clips, multimedia shows, and live video – also curating the soundtracks – and digital photographs, with which he successfully participated in the most important festivals around the world and he exhibited in prestigious institutional and private galleries.

In his Electric Self Anthology, Alessandro Amaducci faces a dark question:

"Do computers dream?"

Gertainly they do: they dream our dreams, reinterpreting them, as we do with them.

The digital world manages to build the language it uses: it is something autonomous that lives on human roots. The human and the digital are two closely interconnected dimensions: heterozygous twins. The monitor becomes a dual instrument: on the one hand it is the transparent mirror that allows passage, on the other it is a mirror that not only reflects, but transmits, communicating its vision of the world.

Turned on for hours and hours, day and night, computers undertake an intimate relationship with our existence: parts of us, our daily lives, our desires, perhaps even our secrets live on their hard drives. They learn to know us over time, they look at us, they observe our world. Left awake, at night, to download data, they accumulate traces of life, knowledge, imaginary; they observe our unconscious which turns into data.

"On the other side of the screen" (as it was said in an old science fiction film) there is something that develops its own unconscious: a technological unconscious, the inverted and transparent mirror of our world transformed into the universe of numbers of the "world beyond".

The coexistence between human and digital is not limited to the one-to-one relationship between person and computer: the Web spreads the language determined by the symbiosis of the two worlds determining another universe made of exchanges, further re-interpretations, creations of hybrid imaginaries: a chaotic and creative place at the same time. The language of images is the most used tool for recognizing oneself and the Internet creates a real network of unconscious: images, archetypes, imaginaries that continually cross the threshold between the human world and the digital world, between re-imagined past and remote future.

Entering the world of the technological unconscious is a dark journey, full of wounds, where bodies that embody some themes that obsessively chase each other, such as life, death, memory, the end of limits, the intertwining of voyeurism and exhibitionism (the desire to look and be looked at), the transformation of the world into spectacle and data, finally the stainless fascinating power of the human form, of the body understood as an esoteric place, as a symbolic space. Entering the technological unconscious also means re-discovering one's own shadow, that dimension where death and life are confused, where one can also play in a cruel way, where beauty and monstrosity can coexist, where fear is necessary because it is a producer of emotions.
